Follow-up work (possible homework task)

Students could use the worksheet, "Tying the Knot", to explore other data on marriage. Alternatively they could search for relevant marriage data on the UK Statistics Authority website (http://www.statistics.gov.uk/glance/). Possible questions that students could attempt to answer are

- How has the age of first marriage changed over time?
- Do men marry at roughly the same age as women?
- Has there been a change in where weddings have taken place?


Students could write an article discussing their findings.


